

- Asknearbyresidentsbeforepitchingifyouwishtocamp nearhouses.
- Remembervehicleshaveagreatimpactonvegetation.Park onhardgroundoronasafemetalledarea.ltisbetterto walktoyour carthandrivetoyourtent.
- Avoidsitesthatareatriskofbeingoverused.Congreg ationalroadsidecampingcancausesignificantproblems.
- Takeparticularcarewithtoilethygiene.
- Ifyouarejustlookingfora placeforafewhourssleep,then pitchlate,leaveearlyandbeunobtrusive.

- TheLandReform(Scotland)Act2003andScottishOutdoorAccess
 Codecameintoforceon9thFebruary2005.TheActestablishesastat toryrighttocampandtheCodedescribestheresponsibilitiesandbest practiceguidancethatshouldbefollowedwhenexercisin gyourrightto campwild.
- AsectionintheTrespass(Scotland)Act1865, which contained an fence of camping on land without the consent of the owner or occupier, has been repealed via Schedule 2 of the Land Reform (Scot land) Act 2003. The 2003 Act confirms that camping is a law ful activity when done by a person in the exercise of the access rights created by the Land Reform Act.
- The Scottish Outdoor Access Code contains guidance on the responsibilities that accompany the access rights in the Act. The Code provides specificative on wild camping and recommends that in order to avoid causing problems you should not campinenclosed fields of crops or farmanimals. - Deadwoodisanimportanthabitatforinsectsandmanysmallan mals, soitisbesttoavoidfiresevenforcooking.
- Lightingfiresposesahighfireriskonpeatysoilsandclosetotinder drygrass.Ahighriskoffirecanexistatanytimeofyear,andnotjust intimesofdrought.

MINIMISEDISTURBANCETOWIL DLIFE

- Watercoursesandlochsidesareimportantsitesforbirdsandan mals.Takeextracarewhencampingnearburnsandlochs,andtryto avoidcampingimmediatelybesidethem.
- Foodscraps(evenwhenburied)attractscavengingbirdsandan mals,someofwhichpreyonmorevulnerablenestingbirds.Carryall scrapsoffoodoutwithyou.
- Bepreparedtomoveifyoubec omeawarethatyouaredisturbing nestingbirdsoranimals.

TOILETHYGIENE

- Alwaysfindaspotatleast30metresfromfresh /runningwaterwhen goingtothetoilet.
- Buryexcrementinasmallhole(notunderboulders). Atrowelorice axecanbeusedtoliftaflapofturf. Inareasofsensitiveuplandveg tation, suchasthe Cairngormsplateau, vegetation takes along time torecover, soholes should not be dugatall.
